

Leadership Office Hour: Beyond COVID

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Three Archetypes of the Future

Expectable

Extrapolates current trends and models

Desperate

A feasible set of significant challenges

Aspirational

A pathway to surprising success

Scenario 1 **Making It Through**

- Delicate balance between unemployment and deaths
- Political divide over "social distancing"
- Medicaid and telehealth expanded, but reimbursements reduced
- New sources of funding for CHCs e.g., for COVID testing
- · CHCs stock up on PPE and educate highrisk groups
- Racial disparities left unaddressed
- 3 million cases, 135,000 deaths





Implications:

- Slimmer margins
- Challenges in predictive planning

Opportunities:

- Collaborate in new ways with hospitals and other community partners
- Do more preventive health education





Scenario 2 On the Way Out

- Reopen, restrict, reopen, ...
- Backlog of non-COVID health issues
- American social fabric unravels
- Riots, violence, attacks on healthcare workers
- Some CHCs cannot make up financial shortfalls
- CMS rules advantage large systems
- Obamacare repealed, Medicaid cut
- 5 million cases, 280,000 deaths





Implications:

- Communities turn inward
- Patients avoid clinics
- Workforce shortages worsen

Opportunities:

- Health education with hardest-hit communities
- Growing Medicaid rolls (if there's \$)
- Diversify payment sources



Scenario 3 **A New Movement**

- 80% of lost jobs return by August
- New tech applied to control virus
- CHCs serve as backbone of COVID-19 testing
- Healthcare reform with public option and risk-adjusted capitated payments
- Economy reorients toward human needs Opportunities:
- CHCs innovate and partner to provide wrap-around services
- New policies to promote racial equity
- CHCs lead effort to address SDOH
- 2.5 million cases, 125,000 deaths





Implications:

- COVID-19 tech not affordable
- CHCs need to be involved in PMPM payment design
- Telehealth gets easier in rural

- Ramp up COVID-19 testing as reimbursable service line
- Deepen and broaden partnerships
- Take services to the patients


Leadership Engagement/Learning Event — Community Health Centers Beyond COVID-19: Exploring Alternative Scenarios for the Pandemic Recovery
