Duty of Care: Live Events

At NACHC, we aim to create effective and meaningful events, and to do so safely. The currently precautions will be taken to help keep everyone safe – from attendees and staff to local hotel employees and vendors. **NACHC considers the safety of all those onsite as our top priority.** Our Duty of Care is a living document that will continue to evolve to enhance the onsite experience and safety for everyone in attendance.

- ✓ Masks are required of all attendees at NACHC Live Events, per CDC recommendations. Masks must fit completely over the nose and mouth. NACHC will have masks available for those who do not arrive with properly fitting face coverings.
- ✓ Hand sanitizing stations or personal hand sanitizer will be provided throughout the venue.
- ✓ Attendees are encouraged to regularly wash their hands with soap and water throughout the day.

In partnership with the event venue...

- NACHC will provide responsible socially distant seating in meetings, as advised by current CDC recommendations.
- NACHC will provide, where possible, appropriate signage/floor decals to reinforce spatial distancing, directions, and safety reminders.
- Food & Beverage will be offered, where applicable, in settings that reduce congregation and communal facilities.
