1. Q: What is included in the donated products?

A: For the products, Henry Schein Cares Foundation will work with each awarded health center to create a wish list. The awardees will receive a catalog link and an excel to fill out with the item codes and quantities (up to the fair market value of \$5,000 per awardee). The only limitations are no equipment included and the products should reflect the program which is being supported. Therefore, products should be for the provision of care, preferably related to heart health and oral health.

2. Q: How often are progress reports due?

A: There are no quarterly progress reports due for this grant. The awarded health centers will distribute a survey link to patients (or a subset of patients), have staff (anticipated 1 to 3 people) participate in a focus group approximately halfway through the project period, and complete a final report at the end of the project period.

3. Q: What information is required in the final report?

A: The final report will include some population health metrics (anticipated information that is included on a UDS report and applicable to oral health and heart health), qualitative testimonials from staff and/or patients, and any pictures from the project/program (optional).

4. Q: What daily time commitment can be anticipated for participants/awardees?

A: The daily time commitment will depend on the specific project a health center is implementing, supporting, or expanding. The funds and donated products are intended to support and supplement the health center's integration of oral health and heart health. For example, projects could be a screening event, a quality improvement project, a pilot test of an education group/class, and more. The consistent component across projects is the topic area – integrating oral health and heart health.

5. Q: Will there be a letter of commitment for awardees?

A: To apply for the Prevention is Power grant, only the document that is downloadable from the NACHC [Partnership & Funding webpage](#) is required. Complete that application and email it to

partnership@nachc.org. For the health centers that are selected as awardees, yes, there will be an agreement signed between NACHC and each of the awarded health centers.

6. Q: Is there an expected minimum number of patient responses to the survey?

A: There is no minimum number of patient responses that you are expected to receive for the survey in order to meet grant requirements.

7. Q: Is there a target patient population for this grant?

A: Each health center can determine who they would like their target population to be.

8. Q: Will patient education materials be made available in additional languages?

A: Patient education materials will be made available in English and Spanish. A third language will be determined based on linguistic need as cited in the related application form question.
